Summary of spending 2017-2018			

Objectives of spending PPG:

Pupil Premium is additional funding allocated to schools by the Government. It is allocated to schools according to Free School Meals (FSM) eligibility.

Our key aim in using the Pupil Premium Grant is to narrow the gap between pupil groups. As a school we have a good track record of ensuring that pupils make good or better progress and our performance data shows that pupils in receipt of the grant achieve equally well. However, from time to time the levels of attainment for children eligible for free school meals are lower - this is also a national trend. Through targeted spending we are determined to make sure that all groups of pupils perform equally and consistently well. For children who start school with skill development lower than that expected for their age, our aim is to ensure that they catch up urgently in order to reach at least the required expectations for their age.

Whole school initiatives supported by Pupil Premium Funding:

- *To raise standards of Teaching & Learning throughout the school across all subjects
- *To improve pupil attainment in Reading & Writing
- *To improve pupil attainment in Mathematics
- *To support children & their families through challenging situations

Pupil Premium Spending:

- *Continue to provide Booster tuition for Year 6 pupils
- *Increase TA hours to mentor/support pupils where necessary in all year groups
- *TA training to enhance pupil support
- *Continue to provide staffing for intervention/pre-teaching groups for identified pupils
- *Purchase resources based on the needs of the pupils
- *To employ an Attendance Officer/Learning Mentor to support children & families
- *To provide a wider range of learning opportunities for our children and enrich the curriculum
