



Sports Premium Report 2017-2018

What is the sports premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16, 2016/17 and 2017/18. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all of their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

The amount that St. John's has been allocated for 2017/18 is £9393

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- provide places for pupils on after school sport clubs
- purchasing equipment and resources

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?
